## 2024-2025 Enrollment Guidelines

*Enroll your 4-year-old in an elementary school that offers a high-quality VPK program taught by certified teachers and credentialed assistants!*

- WHO:** Children who turn four (4) years of age on or before September 1, 2024, and have a VPK Certificate are eligible. Children who turn four (4) between February 2 and September 1, 2024, may attend during 2024-2025 or may wait a year to attend during the 2025-2026 school year.
- WHEN:** All VPK programs follow the District's school year calendar; school starts August 12, 2024.
- WHERE:** The VPK program will be offered at select (not all) public school sites. The list of schools will be posted on the District's website [www.palmbeachschools.org/prek](http://www.palmbeachschools.org/prek) by mid-January 2024. See the back of this flyer for a list of schools currently offering VPK. Private providers also offer VPK.
- WHAT:** The Florida VPK program is voluntary and gives parents choices. Parents may choose the free 540-hour School Year VPK program or the 300-hour Summer VPK program, but not both.
- ★ During the school year, select District elementary schools typically offer the VPK 540 hours of free education from 8 AM to 11 AM daily.
  - ★ Children enrolled in the District's School Year VPK program are eligible to participate in enrichment hours up to 2 PM, creating a seamless 6-hour day from 8 AM to 2 PM. Some schools also offer extended day hours from 2 PM up to 6 PM paid for by Parent Fees or School Readiness vouchers.
  - ★ In Title I schools, enrichment hours up to 2 PM following the free VPK hours are funded by grants and other funding sources; children must live in a Title I school zone to participate.
  - ★ Head Start, Early Head Start, and Migrant PreK programs are offered in select Title I Schools and offer free 10-hour daily programming for eligible children.
  - ★ In non-Title I schools, enrichment and extended hours are funded by Parent Fees or by School Readiness vouchers.
  - ★ Seats are reserved in select Title I and non-Title I schools for Students with Disabilities.
  - ★ During Summer VPK, any child who has not used a VPK Certificate during the School Year VPK program may enroll; enrollment typically starts in May.
- HOW:** **Step 1:** Starting January 1, 2024, obtain a VPK Certificate online at [www.elcpalmbeach.org](http://www.elcpalmbeach.org); for help call the Early Learning Coalition at (561) 514-3300. **Step 2:** Starting in mid-January, view the District's website <https://www.palmbeachschools.org/prek> for a list of participating District schools. **Step 3:** Take your child's VPK Certificate, birth certificate, two proofs of residency, Health Exam Form, and Certificate of Immunization to the school of your choice to enroll.
